Big Question for the week: How often is God's glory at the center of your thoughts, actions, prayers?

Day 1: John 12:20 – 36

Three questions to ponder:

- What is the significance of Greeks wanting to see Jesus?
- When have you experienced the 'death' that comes with following Jesus?
- When have you experienced the "Father's honor" (v.26)?

Day 2: John 12:37 – 50

Two questions to ponder:

- What makes belief in Jesus so difficult today? Compare that to what John says about those in first century (v.43).
- How should we understand the unbelief of people based on the quotes from Isaiah?

Day 3: John 1:3 – 13

Two questions to ponder:

- What echoes of John 1 do you hear in John 12?
- How do these close connections reveal the care John took in writing his gospel?

Day 4: Numbers 21:4 – 9

Three questions to ponder:

- How does Jesus connect this wilderness story with Himself?
- Does belief make sense? In other words, does it make sense that staring at a bronze pole would bring health?
- How is belief in Jesus as the Savior Son of God similar? Different?

Day 5: Luke 22:24 – 30 / Mark 9:33 – 37

Two questions to ponder:

- How do we argue about being the greatest in today's world?
- In other words, where and *in what ways* do we argue about being great? (No one sits down and actually says 'I'm great')

Prayer: That we might serve Jesus by following Him.
